

The Book Inn



Horse Free Curry



Just to be topical the following recipe is highly unlikely to contain any horse DNA as it is made using 'Quorn' pieces, a vegetarian meat substitute available from the Stable Shop.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1x packet of Quorn pieces.
- 1x Whole Onion (Large)
- 1x Clove of Garlic
- 2x Carrots
- 1x Red and 1x Green Pepper
- Half a dozen cardamom pods (not compulsory).
- 1x Tin Chopped Tomatoes.
- 1x Tin Rogan Josh curry sauce.
- 1x Tin of whole button mushrooms
- ½ pint of vegetable stock made from a cube.
- Tomato Purée
- Soy Sauce
- Lemon Juice
- Hot Chilli Sauce

RECIPE:


1. Slice the carrots and dice the red and green peppers (largish pieces). Put them in a bowl with a little water and microwave until just soft.

2. Dice the Onion and a clove of garlic. Fry with a little olive oil in a casserole dish until translucent and soft. Then add the defrosted Quorn pieces and continue frying to give them a golden colour.
3. Add the chopped tomatoes and curry sauce. Heat and stir until the mix starts to boil. Turn heat down to a slow simmer.
4. Add tinned mushrooms, cardamom pods and cooked peppers and carrots. Stir well.
5. Heat thoroughly and add a good squirt of tomato purée, a good shake of Soy Sauce and a squirt of lemon juice. Stir well.
6. At this point add the stock until the mix has the consistency of a thick soup. Stir well.
7. Add the chilli to increase the heat if required.
8. Simmer on the hob or in an oven for about 15 min without a lid. Check occasionally and if the curry is getting too dry add more stock.

Ideally cook the day before and keep in the fridge overnight, it seems to give it more flavour. Then reheat in the microwave.

An Easter Message

One of the reasons why literature relies so heavily on biblical narrative and poetry is because it embraces the full breadth of human experience. The same is true of the Christian calendar.

The themes of lent are well known to all of us – difficult times, struggle, loneliness, heart searching, being tempted to quick-fix solutions just for a bit of light relief.

The themes of holy week are more acute – anguish and grief, despair, darkness.

Whether people have a faith or not, at some point in life pretty much all of these will come our way. If we are fortunate we will have good friends and family and neighbours to comfort and support and perhaps a faith too. We find all of these in the stories of Mary and Thomas and Peter and John and the many others.

And into all of this breaks Easter. Alleluia Christ is risen ! He is risen indeed! Alleluia Alleluia !!

The treats we have come to associate with Easter – chocolate, trips to the garden centre, extra days off work and school.... are lame and feeble. They cannot begin to capture an event that has changed the lives of billions. But imagine a child in Mali suddenly being allowed to go to school, a child soldier back at home, a child sold into prostitution being allowed to be a child again with both day dreams and dreams of a future. These are closer to what we might call Easter. They are brought about

through people who work tirelessly and courageously often at personal cost and risk, on behalf of those who cannot stand up for themselves. And wherever such work is going on – there is the kingdom of God. There is blessing. There is life. Resurrection life.
