A message from The Revd Kara Werner

The Easter weekend is not yet over and folk are not yet back at work – and here I am fast forwarding to thoughts about May and its treasure store of Rogation and the Ascension and Pentecost. The first of these has very strong connections for us who live and work in a rural context. The others complete the Easter season. The first acknowledges a dependence upon God for all our needs and the thankfulness that draws from us. The others together seem to imply the reverse; Jesus is at last leaving the disciples and therefore us too, to the business of carrying on his work on earth without his physical presence there to steer the course. Panic might be the understandable, if not entirely useful, response here.

Alongside these events there are others that occupy our attention and our prayers. All annual meetings will have been held and office holders elected or re-elected. These folk who 'on their watch' keep going the spiritual, the social, the fabric, the financial, the pastoral... who enable each village community to retain that visible focus of God's presence, that often also beautiful building people wish to get married in, that usually still place people often just want to sit in, that meaningful place that looks after our loved ones no longer with us. .. . that place that welcomes the young and old, the confident and fragile, that invites both faith and exploration. It is my opportunity to thank these folk formally and publicly, but significantly also to draw attention to the rather obvious reality that they, and I, will not be here for ever. Who are the new office bearers who will do all that in years to come - not they but perhaps we? It may surprise you that to

be on the PCC you only have to be 16, to be a churchwarden only 18, and people even younger can help out too! May we all know God's blessing as we seek to respond to his love for us by serving his world.
